

Camp Likely Day Camp Covid-19 Safety-Plan

The practices outlined in this document are based on recommendations and orders from WorkSafeBC, BC's Provincial Health Officer, and other industry leaders. The guidance and orders from the BC Provincial Health Officer are continuously changing as the COVID-19 situation is dynamic, and Camp Likely will continue to monitor these updates and make changes accordingly. Overview:

- Camp Likely strongly encourages all eligible campers and staff to be vaccinated at least two weeks before the camp session per BCCDC guidelines.
- The BCCDC Guidance for Summer Day Camps states the Provincial Health Officer's Order on Gatherings and Events does not apply to camps as long as campers and staff are not all in one area and if they are able to practice physical distancing as much as possible.
- In the week leading up to camp, families are asked to monitor their camper(s) for the symptoms of COVID-19.
- Our Williams Lake day programs will not exceed a maximum of 50 campers.
 - Campers will be assigned groups of 8-12 campers and 1-2 leaders for the day.
- Whenever possible, activities will be held outside. In the event of severe weather, activities will be moved indoors, and groups will be appropriately spaced apart according to BC Camps Association guidelines.
- Clear and concise record-keeping by the camp staff of all persons involved in Day Camps and incidents that occur at camp will be documented to help the Provincial Health Officer trace and manage outbreaks.
- All parents, caregivers, children, and staff who have symptoms of COVID-19 OR traveled outside Canada in the last 14 days OR were identified by Public Health as a close contact of a confirmed case must stay home and self-isolate for 14 days before attending Camp Likely.
- No Visitors will be allowed during any day camps.

Parent Drop Off and Pick Up:

- All Pickup and Drop off will happen outside in the main parking lot area of Cariboo Bethel Church. Follow the signs and parking attendants for the correct location. Only one parent or guardian will be allowed to enter the designated registration zone to sign in campers. Parents are not allowed to leave the designated registration zone.
- Parents and caregivers must maintain physical distancing and follow provided markers.
- Drop off for Day Camps will be between **8:00 am – 8:15 am each day**
- Pick up time will be **4:30 pm – 4:45 pm each day**

- A health check at drop-off will be conducted by asking parents and caregivers to confirm that their child does not have symptoms of common cold, influenza, COVID-19, or other respiratory diseases.
- Parents and Campers will be required to sanitize their hands before entering the registration area.
- Camp Staff will sign in and sign out the campers to avoid pens being handled by many people. Please come prepared with the first and last name of whoever you are dropping off, plus the first and last name of the parent or guardian who will be picking the camper up. The parent or guardian who picks up the camper must produce a photo ID.
- Avoid greetings that require physical contact (e.g. high fives, handshakes, hugs).
- Please be kind, calm, and safe, allowing for extra time during the registration and pick-up process.

Program Outdoor Activities:

- Outdoor activities will be prioritized.
- Limited interactions for socializing and outdoor activities between different groups can occur.
- Activities and games will be designed to minimize physical contact.
- Shared equipment will be cleaned and disinfected daily. (e.g., bows and arrows).
- For equipment or surfaces that cannot be easily disinfected, increased attention to appropriate hygiene practices will be implemented.
- Singing is permitted in groups outside.

Program Indoor Activities:

- Campers/staff will engage exclusively with members of their group when participating in any indoor programming, and physical distancing will be enforced between groups.
- More than one group may be in an indoor program or dining facility at one time provided windows/doors to the outdoors are open and it is well ventilated, all persons are adhering to occupancy limits, and different groups are physically distancing from each other.
- Singing will not be permitted in groups indoors.
- Markers will be installed to give guidance to campers when they are in settings where they have to wait their turn.
- Masks will only be required indoors when in closed spaces or poor ventilation.

Cleaning:

- Staff will be trained in all COVID-19 related cleaning policies and procedures.
- Camp facilities will be cleaned in accordance with the BCCDC's Cleaning and Disinfectants for Public Settings document.
- Buildings will be cleaned and disinfected daily.

- High contact surfaces (e.g. shared equipment, doorknobs, light switches, tabletops) will be cleaned and disinfected daily.
- Any visibly dirty surface will be cleaned and disinfected.
- For equipment or surfaces that cannot be easily disinfected, increased attention to appropriate hygiene practices will be implemented.
- All garbage will be emptied daily.
- Appropriate hand hygiene after cleaning will be practiced.
- Washing of hands before and after wearing gloves will be done.

Personal measures:

- Supervised regular hand washing times with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds will be included in the daily schedule.
- Alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol will be used if sinks are not available.
- Staff will assist younger campers with hand hygiene as needed.
- Campers and staff will be reminded to avoid touching their face and to practice proper respiratory etiquette by coughing and sneezing into their elbow.

Food Service:

- Campers/staff will be required to practice proper hand hygiene upon entry into the dining room.
- Camp Likely will adhere to the orders and guidelines mandated by the Provincial Health Officer in regard to the foodservice industries.
- Food services will adhere to WorkSafeBC protocols for restaurants.
- All food preparation will be done by FoodSafe trained staff.
- Indoor meals, campers will eat with their group, and each group will be spaced 2 meters apart from each other.
- Lunch meals will be eaten outside unless the weather is poor.

Camp Staff:

- Staff accommodation is provided for those who require it, and all staff will ensure that they will practice healthy safety and physical distance practices when they go home and in the community on their days off.
- All staff will receive training in the latest COVID-19 policies and procedures.
- When staff return back to camp from the community and days off, they will perform and document self-health assessments for any symptoms of Covid-19.
- Staff will do their utmost to ensure a safe and enjoyable program for all our campers and will provide appropriate care to those who are feeling anxious about Covid-19.
- When inside, staff are always required to wear masks except when in their cabin groups or with other summer staff from the same cohort.
- Each day at camp will have a certified nurse or first-aid attendant on site.

- Lifeguards have undergone the BC Lifesaving Society's "rescue ready assessment" to ensure they can complete all certification requirements.
- PPE guidance will be followed in staff housing when relevant.

Health and Wellness:

- Masks will not be required to be worn outside.
- Masks will be required when campers/staff are inside facilities that are not well ventilated.
- Campers will be reminded regularly about proper handwashing and sanitizing.
- Proper Respiratory Etiquette will be taught and encouraged.
- If any parent, caregivers, child, or member of your family are displaying symptoms of COVID-19, DO NOT send them to camp and inform Camp Likely that they will not be attending camp that day by phoning 604-799-0605 as soon as possible.
- If you suspect that your child or a family member has Covid-19, you may cancel your camper's day at camp up to 24 hrs before the start of camp to receive a full refund.
- Camp Likely will be performing daily self-checks on all staff members for symptoms of Covid-19.
- If any staff member displays any signs of symptoms of Covid-19, they will immediately be self-isolated until they go home. They will not be able to return to work until they are tested negative for COVID-19 and advised that it is safe to do so by public health.
- If any camper displays any signs of symptoms of Covid-19, they will immediately be self-isolated until they can be picked up to go home. Parents will be informed immediately to pick up the camper. The affected camper should isolate at home and contact the COVID-19 helpline at 8-1-1 for the next steps and see if a COVID-19 test is recommended.
- The role of finding, tracing, and managing outbreaks is the responsibility of Public Health, not camp staff.
